#### **JES JUNIOR GIRLS GAELIC 2019/2020**

Next up, the maroon side defeated Coláiste na Coiribe, 6-10 to 3-3. After that, they trekked out to Headford on a very icy morning, narrowly beating them 3-14 to 3-11. They marched on to beat Salerno and St. Pauls Oughterard by an unforgiving score line, which booked them into the Connacht semi final vs. Athenry.

Despite going in as under dogs, the girls beat Athenry 7-4 to 4-3, securing a place in the Junior Connacht C final with Strokestown of Roscommon as their next opponents. With a fresh set of jerseys, kindly sponsored by John Daly of Ireland Food, the girls came up against a confident Strokestown in Ballyhaunis at the end of February. They battled hard and deservingly came out on top with a score of 4-9 to 3-4. This was a momentous day for Jes girl's football as it is the school's first Connacht title in that category.

They eagerly marched onto the All-Ireland semi final facing a tough Tipperary school, Our Lady's S.S Templemore in Rathkeale, Limerick. In the second half, the girls really showed their resilience and fought back making it neck and neck right down to the dying minutes. Amazingly, it was the Jes that came up victorious, winning by one point, 4-5 to 1-13. They were thrilled and deservingly, they won a place in the All-Ireland final, due to be played on April 4<sup>th</sup>.

Sadly, due to COVID-19, they weren't able to finish the journey. It was an amazing and historic year for this superbly skilled Jes team with their mix of players from 1<sup>st</sup> years to 4<sup>th</sup> years.
